E-SAFETY CORNER – SAFE SEARCHES

Safe searching helps avoid inappropriate content online. Child-friendly search engines, like Kiddle or KidRex, can filter out harmful material and you can also set up safe search filters on general search engines like Google. Regularly monitor your child's search activity to ensure they are browsing safely and encourage them to ask for help if they're unsure about anything they find online.
